from the president...

Summer is winding down, but there is still time to enjoy everything ACL has to offer. Here is an update on some of the projects we've accomplished this year.

I was happy to hear that the zebra mussel treatments have been applied and were successful. The test cages installed around the Lake to monitor the treatments experienced a mortality rate of at or near 100%.

In preparation for the 2024 flood mitigation Spillway Project there is a planned drawdown of the Lake this November. The plan is to lower the Lake two feet this year, to gauge the effects it has before we lower it even more next year. You should start seeing communications from ACL staff regarding the drawdown.

The dredging project is winding down and should be complete some time this month.

Budget season is under way. The Budget Commission has started meeting to put together a 2024 budget proposal to send to the Board for approval. I am optimistic that we can balance a budget and keep assessment increases to a minimum.

Some highlights from the August BOD meeting are:

• Approved a contract with Management Matters, as an executive search firm, to assist with finding a new GM.

• Approved additional \$89,000 in funding to CMT for phase 2 of the flood mitigation spillway project.

• Approved moving forward with the building of the Memorial Pavilion west of the Mann Lookout Tower, using \$54,045 from the Memorial Pavilion designated fund.

from the GM...

Through my first month as the Interim General Manager, I have seen a huge improvement in staff morale. I ask our members to be courteous and patient with the staff as myself and the Interim Human Resource Manager, Mike Yorke work to understand where staffing is needed and work to hire to fill these roles.

The weed harvester was back out in the southern portion of the lake last month. Natural resources staff has finished harvesting

North Bay, Winchester Bay, Apache Cove, Hidden Springs Cove, Washington Cove, Blackhawk Cove, and Concord Cove. By the time *The Apple Core* is published, Nixon Beach, Hawthorne Bay, and Independence Bay should also be completed. This month the Natural Resources team will be bringing in the long arm dredge to do additional work in Jefferson Cove, Hickory Cove, and the cove between Council Fire and Eagle.

As the Association moves forward with dam and spillway improvements, The Flood Mitigation AD Hoc Commission and Natural Resources Manager will be conducting an experimental lake drawdown this November. The experiment will involve lowering the lake level by 2 feet. The experimental drawdown will give necessary insight in preparation for the spillway improvements planned for 2024. The current planned improvements would update the dam to meet the current Illinois Department of Natural Resources regulations for dam safety and allow for the water level to be lowered more quickly during a heavy rain event. The Flood Mitigation Ad Hoc Commission has been working closely with the Natural Resources Manager, Tyler Hesselbacher, The Crawford, Milly, and Tilly (CMT), Rubino, and Shannon and Wilson engineering firms to collaborate on the project. The Board approved this project after suffering three major flood events between 2007 and 2017 that threatened the structural integrity of the dam, led to the flooding of ACL buildings, and damage to several docks and property owner's boats. Finally, I would like to introduce Randy Rasmussen as the new manager of The Cove Lakeside Restaurant. Many of you may already have met him over the season as The Cove Supervisor. In light of recent events, Randy has been promoted to The Cove Manager and will be responsible for the day-to-day operations of The Cove Lakeside Restaurant moving forward. Randy has already hit the ground running with his new responsibility and is working closely with the Food and Beverage Commission to implement the vision the Association has for The Cove.





BOARD OF DIRECTORS' MEETING MINUTES

ARCHITECTURAL AND ENVIRONMENTAL CONTROL COMMITTEE MINUTES JULY 8, 2023 **APPROVED**

- 1.0 Call to Order Chairman Dave Allgood called the meeting to order at 8:02 am with the following committee members in attendance: Bill Ware, Dave Allgood, Henry Doden and Jim Frank. Inspector Joe Wiener was also in attendance. Bob Balinger and Nolen Mullen attended via Zoom. John Anderson was absent
- 2.0 Approve Minutes of the May 2023 Meeting Bill Ware Moved, Henry Doden seconded. Motion Carried Unanimously.
- 3.0 Property Owner Comments None
- 4.0 Building Inspector Report There have been 75 permits issued to date tis year. Septic inspections are ongoing. A shed was identified as being placed into the 10' setback. Joe will contact the owners and request that it be moved out of the setback area. The latest changes to the building code were approved by the board and will be posted online. Setback Variance approved by ACL BOD for 12A280 Lincoln Ct goes to the County Zoning Board of Appeals July 25, 2023.
- 5.0 Agenda Approve Revised Agenda Bill Ware Moved, Henry Doden seconded.

Drop Item 7.7 and 7.8 Add Item 7.10 - Deck Permit. Motion Passed Unanimously.

6.0 Unfinished Business - Concerns were discussed related to Greenway Projects within 50' of the lake. Joe will follow up with the Conservation Commission to ensure projects align with current ACL Building Codes and Covenants

7.0 New Business

7.1 Regarding 12A106 Johnson Ln

To permit the construction of a new 3 bedroom 3 bath dwelling with a 1,386- gsf ground floor, a 706gsf upper level, 1,386-gsf basement level below grade without windows, no attached or detached garage, 807-gsf attached deck, driveway, buried LP Tank, 1,500 gal. septic tank and gravel seepage field utility infrastructure as per the attached construction documents. The finishes are LP SmartSide Harvest Honey, Window trim white, Asphalt shingles dark gray. The lot corner posts and structure setbacks must be located and flagged by a licensed surveyor in accordance with ACL Building Code 102.4. A silt fence shall be installed and maintained throughout the project until the ground cover is restored. Disturbed ground shall be seeded and mulched as soon as is practical. A refundable \$500.00 Environmental Debris Bond is required. Jo Daviess County Planning and Development permits, Recorded lot combination documentation, Health Department permit, and Thompson Township Road District culvert approval must be issued before the ACL permit will be considered issued. No variance is granted.

Motion - Jim Frank Moved, Bill Ware seconded. Discussion - All ACL and County Requirements are met. Motion Passed 6 - Aye 0 - Nay 0 - Abstain

7.2 Regarding 2A020 Hidden Spring Ln

To permit within the 100 foot lake setback, the repair of an existing 288-gsf main deck, a 64-gsf lower deck and the replacement of the railings and balusters to meet Code. Materials will be tan composite decking, black aluminum railings, cable balusters and low voltage post mounted lighting. The finished deck will not be larger than 300-gsf. A silt fence shall be installed and maintained throughout the project until the ground cover is restored. Disturbed ground shall be seeded and mulched as soon as is practical. A refundable \$500.00 Environmental Debris Bond is required. Jo Daviess County Planning and Development permits must be issued before the ACL permit will be considered issued. No variance is

The existing structure perimeters must be located and flagged for verification by the Building Inspector prior to excavation. Silt fencing shall be installed and maintained throughout the project until the ground cover is restored. Disturbed ground shall be seeded and mulched as soon as is practical. A refundable \$500.00 Environmental Debris Bond is required. No variance is granted.

Motion - Bill Ware Moved, Henry Doden seconded. Discussion - All ACL and County Requirements are met. Motion Passed 6 - Aye 0 - Nay 0 - Abstain

7.4 Regarding 10A058 Cardinal CtTo







Notes from Natural Resources



ACLPOA Dam & Spillway Improvement Project

The ACL POA is moving forward with dam and spillway improvements which will meet the current Illinois Department of Natural Resources regulations for dam safety at existing dams. The Crawford, Milly, and Tilly (CMT), Rubino, and Shannon and Wilson engineering firms are collaborating to help update the lake's dam and spillway infrastructure. The board approved this project since three major flood events occurred between 2007 and 2017 that threatened the structural integrity of the dam and led to the flooding of ACL buildings. The flood in July of 2017 resulted in the lake water level being within 1.5 feet of overtopping the dam. According to CMT engineer Ted LaBelle, the current state-mandated regulations stipulate that the spillway should pass 60% of the probable maximum flood without water spilling over the top of the dam. The Apple Canyon Lake dam was grandfathered in without meeting the current regulations because the dam was constructed before the regulations were written in 1980. IDNR regulations state that owners of existing dams shall be required to meet regulations to upgrade facilities only if the dam owner makes other major improvements to the dam and spillway. This project will help mitigate future flooding pressures to ACL infrastructure and update our system to meet current regulations. A brief overview of the project is the replacement of the concrete spillway, and the deepening and widening of the channels next to the spillway while the dam will have clay added to raise the top of the dam. The new spillway will include a labyrinth design (aka a zigzag wall) that increases the length of the wall in order to discharge water at a much greater rate while maintaining the current lake water levels. The waterfall will also be lowered; however, the engineers expect it to cover the same width as it currently does so that it maintains its current look during lower flows. The project is expected to be constructed in the fall, but the completion of construction plans and applications for permits will be conducted from now until then by the engineers. If you witness the lake's valve open or people working on top of the waterfall please

The natural resources team here at the lake has been assisting the engineers with taking their measurements and collecting samples for this ACL Board-approved project. We would like to share a couple of interesting insights into our area that we have been able to learn from the engineers and geologists. We learned from Shannon and Wilson's geologist Mark Wieners that the rock we have in our area is 450 million years old from the Ordovician period. The rock is called dolomite which formed when our area was a tropical ocean environment. As the limey/muddy ocean sediment was deposited it hardened over many years to get the cliffs and outcropping of rocks we see today. The engineers used a Geoprobe rock borer to obtain rock core samples so that they could run structural tests on the rock for the spillway project. The engineers also wanted to learn how geological factors such as weathering, erosion, and water will affect the rock in the spillway over time, so Mark was also tasked with taking measurements of the rock cliff faces adjacent to the spillway. Lastly, we assisted Mark with taking clay samples from a clay borrow site west of Nixon Beach where Mark will be testing if it is suitable to be added to the dam. He told us for lake and dam infrastructure engineers look for what they call a "fat clay" that has a silly puddy-like consistency that will flex and bend when it encounters water while still maintaining its overall shape and form.

As noted by Kelsey King in the April 2023 Apple Core, the ACL POA is moving forward with dam and spillway improvements which will meet the current Illinois Department of Natural the top of the dam. The Apple Canyon Lake dam was grandfathered without meeting the current regulations because the dam was constructed before the regulations were written in 1980. However, since some improvements to the spillway need to be made, IDNR regulations require us to meet current regulations for the dam and spillway. This project will help mitigate future flooding pressures to ACL infrastructure and update our system to meet current regulations.

A brief overview of the project is to replace the concrete spillway and deepen and widen the channels in front of and through the spillway. Clay will also be added to the top of the dam to level it.

Although the project was initially scheduled for this fall, major work has been postponed until the fall of 2024 to work out the many details. Due to the amount of rock that must be removed in the spillway channel and in the shelf that exists in front of the weir, the lake level will be lowered to ensure worker safety and reduce the cost of the project. The exact level of the lake lowering will be determined during the bidding process. Since this will affect the entire lake and has never been done before, we are scheduling a smaller reduction in lake depth to try to anticipate any problems that might arise.

In early November of this year, Maintenance, Natural Resource and Security personnel, as well as Volunteers from the Flood Mitigation Commission will open the valve located under the grate just south of the middle of the dam to begin draining the lake into Hells Branch Creek. The goal is to lower the lake 2 feet, which is estimated to take 2-4 days depending on the amount of water flowing into the lake and how wide the valve is opened. This reduction will be maintained for a short period of time, to inspect the lake area for possible problems, and then the valve will be partially closed to return the lake to its normal level. The purposes of this exercise are as follows:

- Determine the length of time to lower the lake level by 2 ft.
- Determine how the valve opening can be adjusted to maintain this lake level given that water is constantly flowing into the lake from various streams.
- Determine how the valve opening can be adjusted to return the lake to its normal level while still maintaining some flow into Hells Branch Creek.
- · Testing a backup valve which will be installed prior to lake lowering.
- Determine any other issues that might arise from lowering the lake level, e.g. docks, etc.
- Security and Volunteers will be onsite to ensure safety and security. They will also survey the lakeshore to determine whether any issues will arise.

Although we expect that most boats will be off the lake by this time, we want anyone having a boat or floating dock around the shoreline to be aware. Boats docked in shallow waters should be moved to docks in deeper water to avoid damage to hulls. We will try to make arrangements for such docks to be available for those few boats still in the water at that time. Private dock owners should evaluate their docks at this time to try to determine whether a greater reduction in lake level will compromise them. Owners may want to consider having floating docks detached from their mounts and tied to the shore.

Notes from Natural Resources: Fish Kill Update!

We want to be as transparent as possible with ACL property owners regarding the recent fish kill the lake experienced last week. On August 2, 2023, Natural Resources got a call that there was a dead walleye along the shoreline by the Marina. We went out and picked up the dead fish but were sadly surprised to find several big fish in the southern half of the lake floating bellied up. We ended up spending the whole day picking up fish that had died- some were fresh, and others looked like they had been dead awhile. Over the next few days, we picked up a couple more fish, but not nearly as many as what we picked on August 2nd. We ended up with a total of 48 dead fish last week that were removed from the lake and properly disposed of. Of these fish 30 were walleye, 4 were Northern Pike, 3 were catfish, and 11 were suckers. We also heard there were crayfish dead below the waterfall. Natural resources cannot confirm their mortality as we were busy with the fish and did not see the crayfish.

Once we saw the severity of the situation on August 2nd, we immediately called our lake consultant Joe Rush for advice on what we should do. At first, Joe advised we collect some fresher fish samples to potentially run mortality tests if need be. He then arrived at our lake the next day to take dissolved oxygen data and assess the situation. He informed us that it is likely the fish died from hot water temperatures and low dissolved oxygen levels. At that time, it was not suspected to be a chemical issue and felt it was not necessary to get the fish tested. The dead fish looked mostly healthy, but some had flared gills and arched backs which are signs of suffocation from low dissolved oxygen levels.

There are many factors that have led to this fish kill. If you think back to the week before this event (July 24-28), we had extremely hot days in the upper 90s the whole week and then a 3-5-inch torrential rainfall. This fluctuation in events adds environmental stress to the fish by lowering dissolved oxygen levels during their already lowest level of the year (which usually occurs end of July- beginning of August). Natural resources and a water quality team monitor the dissolved oxygen levels in the lake monthly and we have noticed July's data has shown there is little to no oxygen present once you reach 15 feet and below in the lake. This means cold water loving fish (walleye) are forced to live in the top 13ish feet of water where there is oxygen available to them, but that water currently has very warm (over 81°F) water temperatures. Walleye prefer much cooler temperatures with an upper limit of 76 °F, and the high temperatures in our lake are putting stress on them. The barometric pressure was also high in the days prior to and during the fish kill. When it rains as heavy as it did prior to the fish kill you also get runoff of nutrients and organic material that bacteria consume which also depletes the lake's oxygen. Chemical treatments done on the lake during this vulnerable time probably also did not help the fish. For these reasons, the ACL Natural Resources Department will not be spraying Nixon Beach or the Marina for the rest of this summer. We will still have the weed harvester running to remove the algae and aquatic weeds in the beach area and around the lake.

We would like to reiterate that big fish tend to go first when their environment fluctuates. We don't know exactly where most of the fish came from, but the majority were found between Nixon Beach and the Marina. We also cannot say for absolute certain what the exact cause of this fish kill was with so many variables at play. ACL did have a smaller scale walleye fish kill around this time last year. Fish kills occur all around the world mostly due to natural causes. ACL is not unique in experiencing these events. ACL will continue to monitor the fishery and keep property owners updated on any future developments

PHASE II RESULTS FROM THE SHORELINE CAGE MONITORING AFTER SECOND TREATMENT

The following is the Treatment Cage Monitor Information from the second phase of our ACL Zebra Mussel Shoreline Control process. The same cage locations were used for the second phase. On inspection, all cages inspected showed a 100% mortality rate. During the inspection, we found no live zebra mussels in the immediate area of the cages. This is outstanding news, as the final process is to be performed on Thursday August 10. While we are enthusiastic about the 100% mortality of zebra mussels, we are unsure if there are any located at 6 feet and deeper, as there was no one on the inspection team who was able to dive and locate them.

During the final treatment process this Thursday, August 10, the lake will not be closed. We are once again asking that if at all possible, property owners refrain from boating while the application process is taking place. If you do decide to go out on the lake, please avoid the areas where the work boat is, and do not interrupt or stop the workers to talk. We will once again have volunteers on the lake reminding boaters to avoid the treatment areas. Avoiding the areas of active application will give the product an opportunity to settle and attack zebra mussels at the deeper depths of Apple Canyon Lake.

The last Phase of the Zebra Mussel Shoreline Control Process should be completed in an hour. Thank You All

ZEBRA MUSSEL SHORELINE CONTROL PROCESS COMPLETION

The shoreline process to help reduce the zebra mussel impact on boaters and recreation swimmers is now complete. This process reduced the zebra mussels in the lake which has allowed the lake to create needed plankton for the fishery. First, it's important to point out this project did not include the Marina, Jumping Rock, or Nixon Beach areas. These areas are the responsibility of ACL and treatments started in May and should continue into September. What did see as a result of the three-phase process:

- The first phase started the massive mortality to the shoreline including boat areas. A Canadian film company using an underwater drone captured video of both before and after images of our shoreline. This information will be presented in a documentary called "All To Clear." Information on this documentary will be sent out when it airs. Dr. Hammond, the inventor of the EarthTec QZ product, traveled from California to consult with McCleud Amytics on the transmission process. Jobs Control of Landau American Science and American Scie
- with McCloud Aquatics on the treatment process. John Cortell, a Lake Management Scientist from Earth Lab Science, also travelled out to Apple Canyon Lake to consult and review on the process. It's important to note that Dr. Hammond worked with McCloud Aquatics in the
- development of the proposal that was used for our lake treatments can also be used for swimming pools and hot tubs. It's safe for swimming. It is also used in state fish hatcheries, as well as in agricultural applications. It is safe to eat fish from treated lakes.
- For both Phase I and Phase II reporting, we used twenty-one treated lakes. For both Phase I and Phase II reporting, we used twenty-one treatment cages that had live zebra mussels in them. They were staged around the lake at varying depths to monitor the progress of treatments. Phase I results were good but still reported that some areas still had zebra mussels. Phase II results were much better with 100% mortality. Visual reports along the lake also showed a massive improvement. Little if any zebra mussels can be seen. If any could be seen, they are all dead. No live zebra mussels could be located for Phase III monitoring. nonitoring
- Phase III process was modified to reduce shoreline treatment but move more treatment to sub-surface to increase morality at deeper depths. The changes were made because of results from the second phase and some underwater video obtained by a homeowner. (Thank You – Scott Collins)
- During the three applications, the ACL recreation boaters were asked to limit boating on the main lake. Thank You all. This did reduce impact on the treatment staff and allowed the product the opportunity to work to kill zebra mussels

Finally, the shoreline will be evaluated after this final treatment. Our Commission does not have equipment to dive down into the lake. We are asking the property owners to send information on docks and boats (pictures) as they start to be removed for the season. Those that sent pictures last year, please send before and after pictures again so we can compare.



Notes from Natural Resources

Exciting news! The endangered species (listed in 2017 by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service) the rusty patch bumble bee was spotted at several prairie sites around the lake this past month!

Pathogens, pesticide usage, and loss of habitat have led to the over 80% decline of this species where it is no longer present in 20 of the 31 U.S. States and Canadian Provinces it h historically inhabited prior to the year 2000. This is an exciting find since it shows that our greenspace areas around the lake are supporting a vulnerable species that needs a constant supply of diverse blooming flowers as well as adequate nesting and overwintering habitat.

This bumble bee is identifiable by the brown patch on its abdomen and has yellow surround the brown patch. You can look around your gardens to see if the rusty patch bumble bees a utilizing your blooms! We urge you to not disturb them as they are a federally protected species, and we would love to get reported sightings/pictures from you via email at: naturalresources@applecanyonlake.org.
